



Artist Christopher Fennell is seeking a Public Art Assistant who will help with gathering materials for his Fort Worth Public Art Project. The assistant must be local and an artist with a pickup and trailer to sort through donated materials, organize it, and transport it to a shipping center.

Christopher Fennell uses locally recycled materials to build site-specific installations across the United States. The artist places recognizable objects into organic forms: like a wave of 60 canoes, a ball of 600 baseball bats or a tornado of 120 bicycles. He has a local installation in Allen, Texas at fire station #48: a fireball sculpture using decommissioned aluminum fire ladders. Fennell is currently working with Fort Worth Public Art for a project along North Beach Street.

#### About the Position:

#### **Hours: Flexible.**

Anticipating a full day every other month sorting through the donated materials at the North Ft. Worth Trash/recycle Drop Off Station, loading and driving a truck and trailer with preferred materials to a shipping center south of downtown Ft. Worth near the intersection of I 20 and I 35. Assistant will load it into a semi-trailer for shipment to the artist.

This process will be ongoing periodically over the next two years.
